The Ascension of our Lord

May 25th - 40 Days After The Resurrection

Forty days after each Easter, many Christians around the world celebrate the Ascension. It's the day when the resurrected Christ was raised up from the earth into heaven. The Ascension is the prelude to Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came upon the gathering of disciples, including the apostles, in Jerusalem.

While many Christian churches celebrate Pentecost, the Ascension of Our Lord is often passed over because it always falls on a weekday, forty days after Easter Sunday. After the Resurrection, our risen Lord instructed his followers not to leave Jerusalem. It was there, Jesus said, that they would receive "the promise of the Father" (Acts 1:4, NRSV). What was that promise? It was that they would be baptized with the Holy Spirit. Shortly after that utterance, Jesus was "lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight" (v. 9).

So why did Jesus go away? Why did he "ascend to the Father?" Jesus answered this question when he confided in his disciples before his arrest:

16:7 "Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. ...¹³ "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears ...¹⁴ He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ...¹⁶ "A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me." (Excerpts from the 16th chapter of St. John)

Jesus' Ascension was his return to the Father. When the Day of Pentecost came, the Father sent the Spirit to indwell all believers as a seal of their salvation. The Spirit, as part of the Trinity, is "God with

us.” The Spirit is Christ present with us, all the time, with every single believer, in every single place on earth.

I always wondered why we never hear the disciples or the Apostle Paul wistfully talk about the time Jesus was with them during his earthly ministry, saying something like, “the Spirit of Christ in us is very special, but we sure miss having Jesus here with us in the flesh.” Of course, the reason they did not “miss” Jesus is because He was truly with them through the Spirit. They weren’t “keeping his memory alive” as some might think when they hear the words, “Do this in remembrance of me.” Their relationship with Jesus, their relationship with the Father, was not only “alive” because of the Spirit, it was even better than before.

The 16th-century theologian John Calvin said this about the Ascension:

“Christ left us in such a way that his presence might be more useful to us — a presence that had been confined in a humble abode of flesh so long as he sojourned on earth As his body was raised up above all the heavens, so his power and energy were diffused and spread beyond all the bounds of heaven and earth.” ❧

National Day of Prayer

May 4th, 2017

The National Day of Prayer is an annual day of observance held on the first Thursday of May, designated by the United States Congress, when people are asked "to turn to God in prayer and meditation".

The modern law formalizing its annual observance was enacted in 1952, although earlier days of fasting and prayer had been established by the Second Continental Congress as early as 1775.

In 1952 during the Korean War, the desirability of a united national prayer was stated by Reverend Billy Graham, who said, "What a thrilling, glorious thing it would be to see the leaders of our country today kneeling before Almighty God in prayer. What a thrill would sweep this country. What renewed hope and courage would grip the Americans at this hour of peril." *(source: Wikipedia)*



Cooksville Homestead Worship Services

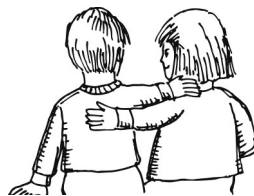
The Non-Traditional

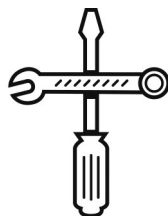
Thank you for your “gifts and love” because I know when I miss being with you physically, my heart and mind will feel and recognize your presence.

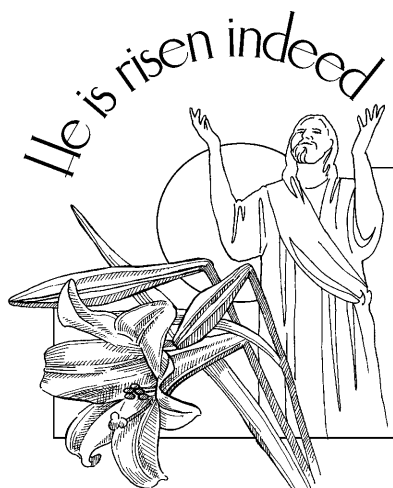

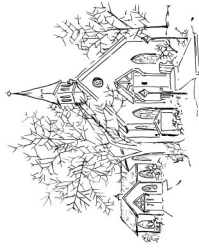
