This is a visual reminder that whenever we stand before God, we stand in the presence of the saints who worship God with us. Whenever we commune, we are joined to the body of Christ — which is a real living community of all who have died and all the baptized throughout the world.


As we grow older we have more and more people to remember, people who have died before us. It is very important to remember those who have loved us and those we have loved.


